Romans 8:31-39 (NASB)

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? If God *is* for us, who *is* against us? ³² He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things? ³³ Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies; ³⁴ who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. ³⁵ Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶ Just as it is written,

"FOR YOUR SAKE WE ARE BEING PUT TO DEATH ALL DAY LONG;
WE WERE CONSIDERED AS SHEEP TO BE SLAUGHTERED."

³⁷ But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord

Joy Meter

A few weeks ago, my wife and sister-in-law decided to offer a VBS for kids in our neighborhood. I thought they were crazy! Three days before it started, Laura came to me and said, *"We have way more kids signed up than expected, and we need your help!"* I thought, *"Uh-oh!"* and asked hesitantly, *"What do you need me to do?"* She said, *"We need you to teach the Bible lessons."* I asked, *"What are the lessons?"* She said, *"Whatever you want them to be!"* Now, listen I'm an ordained PCA Pastor, but I was immediately overwhelmed at the thought of coming up with five days of VBS Bible lessons that would hold the attention of twenty-plus children ages 4 to 12! I wanted to hide under a rock, but it all worked out and the whole week turned out great!

In all that's going on in our world right now, it's so easy to feel overwhelmed, discouraged, anxious, and fearful, but I'm finding that those feelings are directly related to our focus. When I was focused on preparing Bible lessons for VBS and serving the kids and parents, my "Joy Meter" was a 10 every day (despite all that was happening in the news), but recently, I've drifted toward too much focus on social media, news, etc. and I've noticed my joy meter ticking downward. I'm guessing you can relate. It is important to be informed about current events, but we can't let current events affect us more than the truth of the gospel. In these times especially, we need to remember Jesus' words in John 16:33, *In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.* What a relief! And why did Jesus overcome the world? Because of His love for YOU!

Our neighborhood VBS memory verse was from 1 Corinthians 13:13, *And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.* Why is love the greatest? Because God is love, everything else is meaningless without love (see 1 Cor. 13:1-3), and love is the only one of these three that will last for all eternity. On top of all that, love conquers all (fear, anxiety, anger, etc.). At the end of the day, love wins. So, let's be on the side of love—both in our receiving from God and in our giving to others. How about this week, let's all try to focus less on social media, breaking news, and talk radio and more on gospel media, good news, and God's talk radio (the Word and prayer)?

By the way, the 4th of July is a great time to connect with and love your neighbors (even from a safe social distance)! If you help their joy meter tick upward, yours will, too.
