Family Discipleship Devotional (To Be Led by Parent)

May 16, 2021

Truth: (Luke 11:1-4)

Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." And he said to them, "When you pray, say:

"Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

Give us each day our daily bread,

and forgive us our sins,

for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us.

And lead us not into temptation."

Equipping: (Discussion questions)

1. Why did his disciples want to learn to pray? They saw Jesus praying and it made them want to learn as well! If Jesus took time to pray, then we need to take time too!

2. Why is "Father, hallowed be your name" a good way to start your prayer? It addresses God and his awesomeness! It shows He is powerful and mighty. Jesus tells us to start praying by praising God!

3. What does it mean to "give us our daily bread and forgive our sins"? We ask God to provide for a need such as food and our BIGGEST need which is forgiveness of our sins!

4. What part of the prayer is asking God to help us do the right thing? The last verse says that we try to forgive others along with asking God not to lead us into temptation!

5. How important is prayer in our walk with God? So important!!

Our walk with God is a relationship and, in a relationship, communication is key! Talking to our Father brings us peace and keeps us in line with the Spirit!

6. What are some different words or phrases you can use to praise God?

Accountability:

1. How is your prayer life? Do you need to commit to speaking with God more often?

2. Are there any sins you need God to forgive you for? Simply ask and He will forgive you!

Mission:

1. In the Scripture we read today, it said "for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us."

2. Is there anyone in your heart that you need to forgive?

3. Is there anyone that does not know Jesus that you want to pray for?

4. Thinking of what you learned today, is there someone you want to share this with? Maybe even pray with them afterward!

Training the body has some value. But being godly has value in every way. It promises help for the life you are now living and the life to come. - 1 Timothy 4:8

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Supplication:

Use the scripture that Jesus taught his disciples in Luke 11:1-4 to end your time in prayer!

Example: "God, we are so thankful that you hear our prayers. We are thankful that we can pray to you anytime, anywhere, and about anything. Thank you that Jesus gave us an example of how to pray. Thank you that he taught us that we should praise you, ask for the things we need each day, ask for forgiveness, give forgiveness, and ask for help to live like Jesus. Please continue to teach us to come to you about anything. You love us so much, and we are so thankful for your Son, Jesus.

Say together:

Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation. In Jesus's name we pray, amen."
